

1. EXCISION (NOUN): cutting

Synonyms: ablation, extirpation *Antonyms:* addition, insertion

Example Sentence:

The excision of the weed plant was successfully done.

2. EXCRUCIATING (ADJECTIVE): torturous

Synonyms: agonizing, grueling *Antonyms:* calm, mild

Example Sentence:

This is an excruciating task.

3. ETHOS (NOUN): ideology

Synonyms: mentality, mindset *Antonyms:* body, physicality

Example Sentence:

He abides by his ethos.

4. EXPANSIVE (ADJECTIVE): broad

Synonyms: extensive, inclusive *Antonyms:* narrow, reserved

Example Sentence:

This is an expansive project.

5. FACILE (ADJECTIVE): easy

Synonyms: effortless, glib *Antonyms:* arduous, confusing

Example Sentence:

She likes doing facile things.

6. ENERVATE (ADJECTIVE): tire

Synonyms: debilitate, exhaust Antonyms: energize, strengthen

Example Sentence:

He was enervated by the mettlesome picnic.

7. EXALT (VERB): extol

Synonyms: glorify, laud Antonyms: blame, castigate

Example Sentence:

He exalted about his achievements yesterday.

8. EXIGUOUS (ADJECTIVE): scanty

Synonyms: bare, little Antonyms: large, plenty

Example Sentence:

She poured an exiguous amount of dry yeast.

9. ENFEEBLE (VERB): make very weak

Synonyms: cripple, blunt Antonyms: invigorate, energize

Example Sentence:

This acid enfeebled the whole chemical reaction.

10. VICARIOUS (ADJECTIVE): done or felt for

Synonyms: delegated, deputed Antonyms: compressed, insipid

Example Sentence:

John experienced vicarious pain as his wife's leg is fractured.
