

1. CONTINUANCE (NOUN): duration

Synonyms: extension, period **Antonyms:** ending, finish

Example Sentence:

She will get all the privileges during his continuance in the service.

2. GRUBBY (ADJECTIVE): dirty

Synonyms: filthy, soiled **Antonyms:** clean, spotless

Example Sentence:

His white coat was grubby and stained.

3. AVENGE (VERB): retaliate

Synonyms: vindicate, punish **Antonyms:** cheer, forgive

Example Sentence:

Hamlet delayed avenging the murder of his father.

4. SATE (VERB): satisfy

Synonyms: gratify, satiate **Antonyms:** abstain, deprive

Example Sentence:

He was sated with flying.

5. MACULATE (VERB): corrupt, violate

Synonyms: besmirch, degrade **Antonyms:** honour, praise

Example Sentence:

The population had not been maculated by inferior races.

6. HIDEOUS (ADJECTIVE): Very ugly

Synonyms: grotesque, horrible **Antonyms:** delightful, gentle

Example Sentence:

She saw a hideous face at the window and screamed.

7. SINGE (VERB): Burn

Synonyms: blaze, blacken **Antonyms:** frost, glaciare

Example Sentence:

She singed her dress by pressing it with too hot an iron.

8. DISTEND (VERB): Amplify

Synonyms: dilate, augment **Antonyms:** abridge, decrease

Example Sentence:

The excess food consumption made his stomach distend from bloat.

9. FRAILITY (NOUN): Weakness

Synonyms: defect, fallibility **Antonyms:** advantage, perfection

Example Sentence:

Despite her frailty she manages to work hard.

10. GRANDIOSE (ADJECTIVE): Theatrical

Synonyms: ambitious, bombastic **Antonyms:** trivial, moderate

Example Sentence:

He produced several grandiose schemes for a holiday resort but no resort was ever built.
