

1. **FLAMBOYANT (ADJECTIVE)**: Extravagant

Synonyms: glamorous, ornate

Antonyms: dull, plain

Example Sentence:

He always wears flamboyant clothes to make people notice him.

2. **QUACKERY (NOUN)**: charlatanism

Synonyms: trickery, deception

Antonyms: reality, frankness

Example Sentence:

The meanest and most contemptible kind of cheating is quackery.

3. **ABRADE (VERB)**: scrape

Synonyms: erode, grate **Antonyms**: rebuild, please

Example Sentence:

In all cases, however, a hard file will abrade the surface of the false stone.

4. **HOARSE (ADJECTIVE)**: raspy in voice

Synonyms: harsh, gruff

Antonyms: polite, smooth

Example Sentence:

His voice turned hoarse after he addressed several meetings

5. **ACQUIESCE (VERB)**: to agree.

Synonyms: conform, accede

Antonyms: refuse, deny

Example Sentence:

Sara acquiesced in his decision.

6. JUDICIOUS (ADJECTIVE): wise

Synonyms: astute, accurate

Antonyms: careless, ignorant

Example Sentence:

A judicious selection of books is essential to success.

7. CONTORT (VERB): Deform

Synonyms: gnarl, writhe

Antonyms: straighten, smooth

Example Sentence:

Corrupt politicians have contorted the face of politics.

8. SHARDS (NOUN): Fragments

Synonyms: dregs, particles

Antonyms: whole, core

Example Sentence:

She kicked away a few shards of glass.

9. PAUCITY (NOUN): Scarcity

Synonyms: dearth, insufficiency

Antonyms: sufficiency, enough

Example Sentence:

The paucity of trained medical professionals is a major challenge for India.

10. PERILOUS (ADJECTIVE): Dangerous

Synonyms: hazardous, rugged

Antonyms: calm, firm

Example Sentence:

Efforts were made to escape the necessity of accepting the perilous aid.
